Contents: 26 alphabet puzzles plus 2 complete alphabet puzzles

There are various ways to play with this alphabet set and it is hoped that parents and teachers will work the game towards the need of the child or children playing.

Game 1 - with parental or teacher guidance
Separate the pieces and give the pictures to the child. He/she should lay these face-up in front of him/her. Hold up a letter piece and ask the child to try to read the letter and word beneath, (if they have difficulty with this one go to another and return to it later.) The child should then try to pick the matching picture piece. Ask the child to say aloud what they think the picture is. If the picture matches the letter then the child can complete the puzzle. Continue in this manner until all puzzles are complete.

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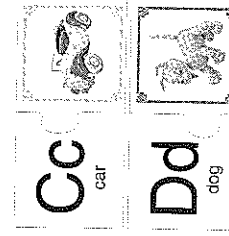
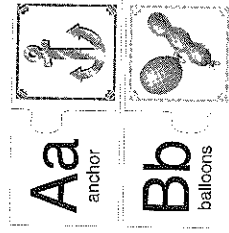

Game 2 - without guidance

Separate the letters from the pictures and lay all the pieces in a jumble face-up over the play area. The child should then try to pair up the correct letters, word and picture.

Only the correct combinations will join together so children can see for themselves when two pieces do not go together.

When more than one child is playing the players can take it in turn to try and make a pair. When all the pieces have fitted together the player who has completed the most pairs is the winner.



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
